

SESSION MEETING February 15, 2024

Clerk's Report: January attendance at worship (in person / online): January 7: 52 / 6; January 14: 0 (Blizzard) / 32; January 21: 49 / 10; January 28: 58 / 12; Average Sunday Attendance = 40 / 15. Membership as of January 31, 2024:177. Communion: January 7: 52

Christian Education: Dementia training was the February multigenerational event. March 3 multigenerational event is Lenten pretzels; Scout Sunday will be February 25th.

Funds: Motion approved rolling over LIFE Center new building CD5 and CD6 into May 2024 and putting CD7 into the bank account for LIFE Center new building expenses this spring.

L.I.F.E Center: Discussion of layout and location, budget and fundraising.

Mission: Winter Mission Project for Families Helping Families has concluded. The delivery happened 2/14/24. We donated 308 items to grow their clothing closet. One Great Hour of Sharing Season – discussion about fish banks – how they've been done in the past and how to do it going forward. This Sunday (2/18) will distribute fish banks and return them on Palm Sunday (3/24).

Property: Estimate for hard surfacing parking area after new construction. Awning update —will cost about \$5,300. Awning will happen this year. February 4th the upper elevator door didn't work. Larry contacted AEL and they came out to fix it. Manse has yearly HVAC inspections and cleanings. Church window frames need painted.

Worship: Volunteers determined for communion service on February 18. Maundy Thursday all currently serving Elders will help with beef stew and serving communion. We will have communion on Easter.

MARJ NEJDL: MASTER FOLK ARTIST

at The National Czech and Slovak Museum January 27 – April 21, 2024

Marj Nejdl learned to decorate eggs in the traditional Czech style at an early age. Continuing the tradition was important because Nejdl knew egg decorating was a skill that had been passed down for more than 2,000 years. Nejdl was also a natural-born artist. She studied commercial art in Chicago before beginning her family. Beyond her work with egg decorating, she has kept busy over the years with various art forms including painting folk scenes on a variety of media including wood, ceramics, and stationery. She

also illustrated many books published by the Museum Guild of the National Czech & Slovak Museum & Library, and designs an annual Christmas ornament for the Museum Store.

The exhibit features examples of Nejdl's folk art including decorated eggs, a quirky birdhouse, aprons, book illustrations, paintings and Christmas ornaments.
